What's new? How about 67 quilts out there helping to keep some of our community members warm! SOS delivered the quilts to Families Helping Families, 4 Oaks, ASAC, Willis Dady Shelter, Freedom Foundation, Mercy House of Hospice and



more. Smiles and thanks were received at each delivery!
Keeping warm is such a basic need, and isn't it a wonderful
feeling to be able to help with that need doing something
we love!

SOS has the number of quilts we need for the Linn County Daycare's graduation taking place in May, but we still need quilts for those kiddos graduating in August. These quilts should be about 40"x50". We ask for the 40" width, so as not to have to piece the back. In addition, we are waiting for the final number of quilts needed for Families Helping Families. Graduating teens will age out of the foster care system and the organization hopes to provide each graduate with a twin size quilt as they navigate the next chapter of their lives.

SOS will be meeting on April 17, the third Wednesday of the month, at the Knights of Columbus, 1620 E Ave NE, from 9:00-3:30. We will tie quilts, envelope small quilts, and sew tops all while noshing on the worlds best potluck! WE NEED ALL THE HELP WE CAN GET! Getting your beautiful quilt tops made into a finished quilt is our biggest hurdle. If you could come for any part of the day, it would be greatly appreciated! We will also be tying quilts between the meetings on April 22, from 1:00 to about 3:30. All flying fingers welcome!

SOS also uses a lot of 2.5" x 4.5" pieces, sewn into various settings. Below are two pictures of blocks we will be using; any scraps in your sewing room that need a new home would be welcome at the SOS table! If they're cut into those dimensions, SOS would be one step closer to a finished quilt!

His immediate family lives in Arizona and were unable to attend. One guest will be 100 in a couple weeks and had been awarded a Quilt of Valor 4 or 5 years ago. 1<sup>st</sup> Class Sgt. Brandon Blue, Army Recruiter, honored Curt with words of appreciation and a salute after he was wrapped in his quilt, made by Sherri Dohrmann.



Sgt Blue: "Curt has many memories of the 55th Military Police company in Korea and made lifelong friends. He was stationed at Fort Rucker, Alabama at the time of Kennedy's assassination. Curt truly believes that oaths taken to honor and serve are for a lifetime. His front yard displays the American and POA flags along with a statue of a kneeling statue at its base to honor all those who served and are serving our country."

# **April- Quilts of Valor®** *continued*

Under Our Wings: Barb Brown's second UOW session resumes following the Spring Break. The attendees will be starting their Quilts of Valor®. Mentors include Jan Felthous, Jan Lacy, Nancy McGovern, Julie Hearity, and Karen Osenbaugh. Students include Ella Stimple, Gabriel Rasmussen, Ella Haulseorth, Anna Mei Masterson, Ayla Poyeh, Jacey Walker and Lucas Rasmussen.

The Destinations Project continues to provide quilts to similar groups that are in need for Quilts of Valor to award to their veterans. Linda Martien, the Missouri State Coordinator, had a QOV booth at the AQS (American Quilter's Society) show in Branson, Missouri and displayed the Freedom Stitchers' amazing quilts. Attendees were stunned by the skill and creativity of the quilting artists. She also traveled to Hamilton, MO for a presentation hosted by Missouri Star Quilt Company. These quilts were awarded to nine of the fifteen veterans. Linda commented that if were not for these quilts she could not have had a display of Quilts of Valor in the AQS show or to have awarded so many veterans and is extremely appreciative for the quilts. Linda has requested another batch of quilts that will be traveling to Missouri via the 'Underground quilt railroad', Don's sister, Marilyn Bishop.

The Destinations Project continues to provide quilts for VA hospitals. On March 7, six quilts were sent to the VA Greater LA Healthcare System in Los Angeles, CA. They provided this response:

"The VA Greater LA Hospital serves 80,000 veterans in over 3 counties with 11 facilities. Voluntary social workers award deserving veterans (and their families) with Quilts of Valor. Our veterans have always reacted with complete surprise at a quilt presentation-universally there are tears and something to the effect that "I didn't know anyone would care so much"-it's very touching. The quilts are treasured by the veteran and his family and are one of the finest things we do for this segment of our veteran population. QOV has been one of our tremendous supporters, and they appreciate everything we do."

**Pattern Donation:** Moria Guffey generously donated a very large binder of Fons & Porter QOV patterns that she had accumulated for a very long time. Each complete pattern was inserted into page protectors .




